

Watertown Middle School After-School Programming Winter, 2012

Watertown Middle School offers many different kinds of after-school activities. Sign-ups begin Wednesday December 21st and end on Friday January 6th. Clubs and the Learning Lab start the week of January 9th. Some sports start sooner.

After-school programming comes with a one-time activity fee that helps to cover costs. The activity fee is \$100 for all activities including interscholastic sports. The fee is \$50 for all activities excluding interscholastic sports. With the one-time activity fee, students can participate in as many after school activities as they like. Programs that are exempt from the activity fee include the Library Learning Lab, grant-funded clubs, and community service programs and activities. Remember, if you have already paid an activity fee for the fall, you are covered for the whole year and do not have to pay a fee in the winter. Families eligible for free or reduced-price lunches do not have to pay an activity fee.

LIBRARY LEARNING LAB

The Library Learning Lab is a place where students can go after school, Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday afternoons, when they need help with their assignments or a place to do homework. Students can sign up for the Library Learning Lab before school, at lunch, or in the library before 6th period. Students need to indicate to staff what area they need help and how they will get home (a late bus is available).

INTERSCHOLASTIC SPORTS

The purpose of the middle school athletic program is to provide students an opportunity to develop athletic skills, sportsmanship, and team-play in a wide variety of sports. Some sports will field everyone; others will have tryouts. Many middle school sports teams have "A" and "B" teams, which give more students a chance to practice and play.

WMS Sports sign-ups will be during the first and second weeks of school. All physicals must be up-to-date and the yellow Clearance for Athletic Participation form must be completed and signed in order for a student to participate. Families of students participating in interscholastic sports must pay a one-time \$100 activity fee, which encompasses all after school activities all year. Coaches will give out practice and game schedules for each sport. Introductory meetings have already taken place; however, if a student has missed the meeting, he or she can come to the office and we will provide him or her with the necessary paperwork and connect him or her to the coach. Some winter sports have tryouts.

COMMUNITY EXPLORERS **Ms. Wood / Ms. Harvey / Ms. Tompkins**

Community Explorers is a full-year, two-day-a-week after school program for students that provides a variety of activities, including community field trips, shopping, cooking, and recreational and fitness programs. Community Explorers meet on Mondays and Thursdays, 2:15 – 4:15. Often, Community Explorers may even go later, especially when they take field trips. The Community Explorers program runs for the full year and we do wish students to attend both days per week for educational continuity purposes.

ENRICHMENT CLUBS

Winter enrichment clubs meet one day a week after school, 2:15-4:15. Winter clubs start the week of January 9th and will last for 10 weeks. Participation in many clubs is subject to a one-time \$50 activity fee. Remember, if you have already paid the fee for a fall activity, you don't have to pay for a winter club. Clubs that are asterisked are grant-funded and are not subject to fees.
